Two of these PSA stewardesses are twins. Can you guess which two? Draw a circle around them.

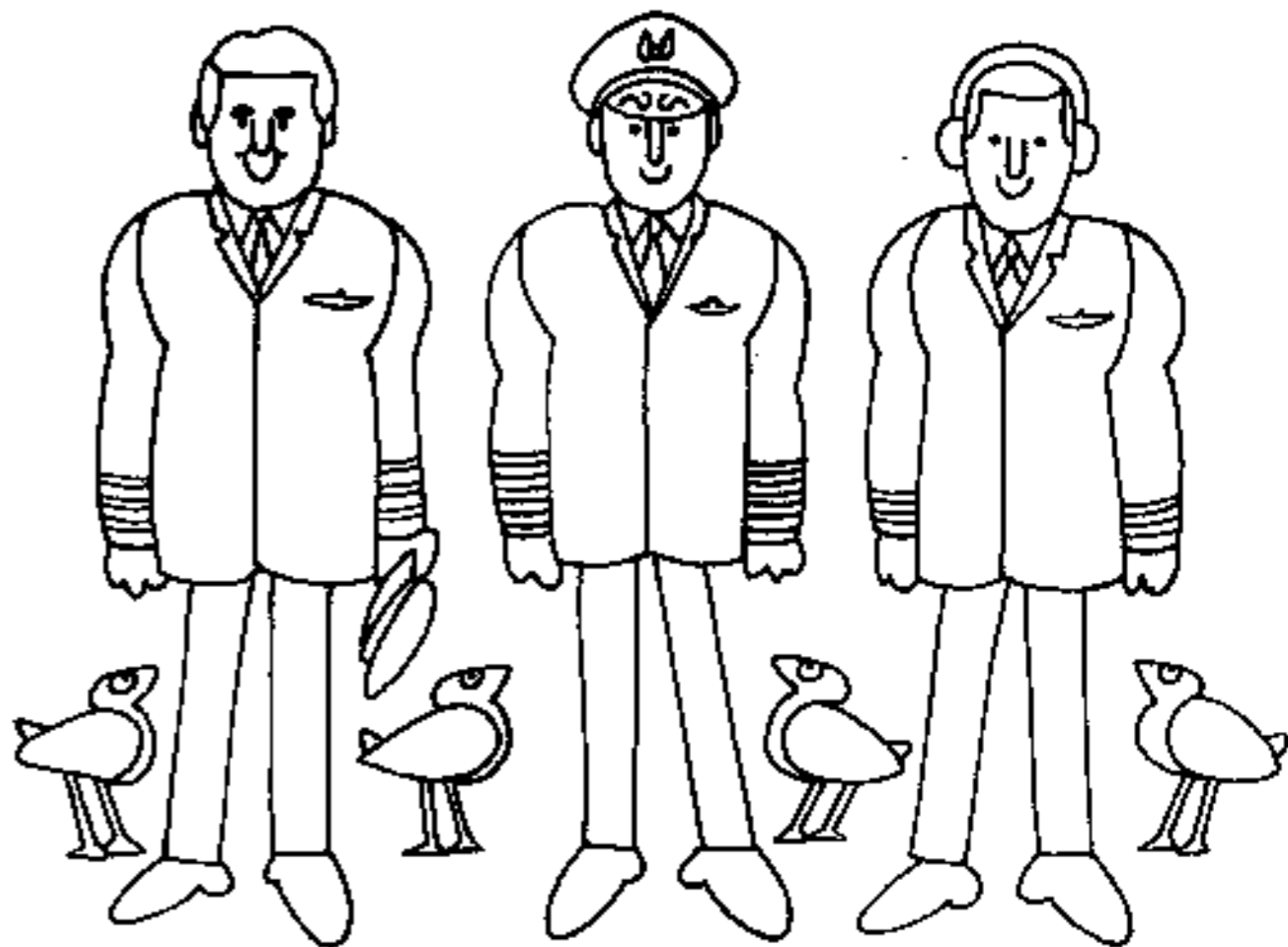


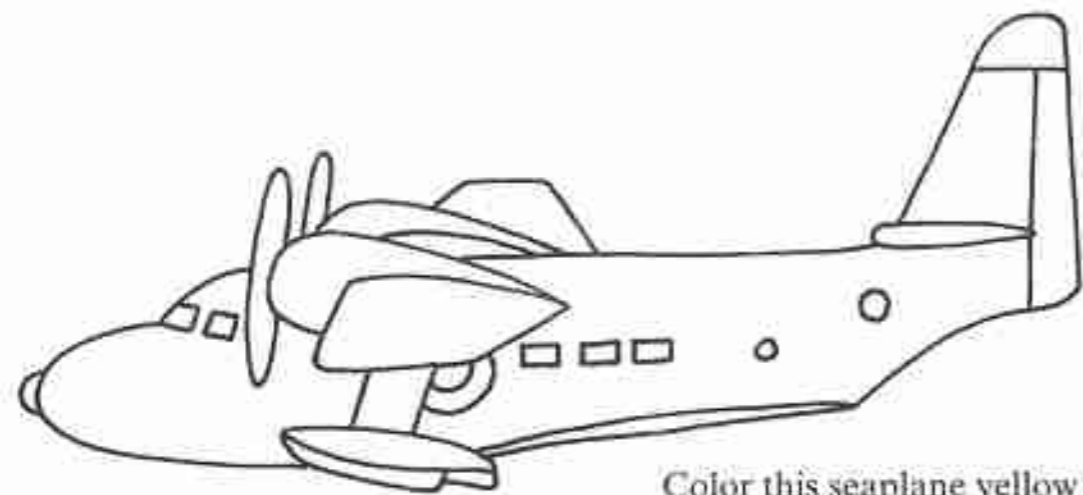
(If this is your first plane ride, ask your stewardess to give you a First Flight Certificate.)



Captain's wings. After you color them, cut them out and pin them on your shirt or dress.

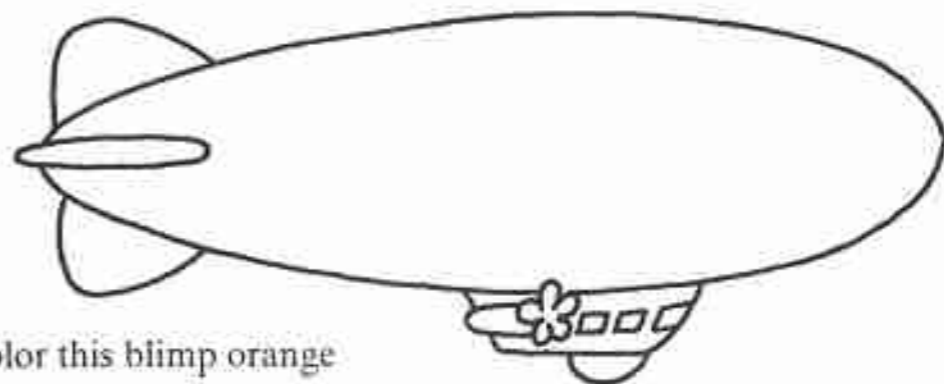
These are the men who fly your airplane. The one in the middle, with four stripes, is the captain. Color the stripes gold. The other men are the co-pilot and the flight engineer.



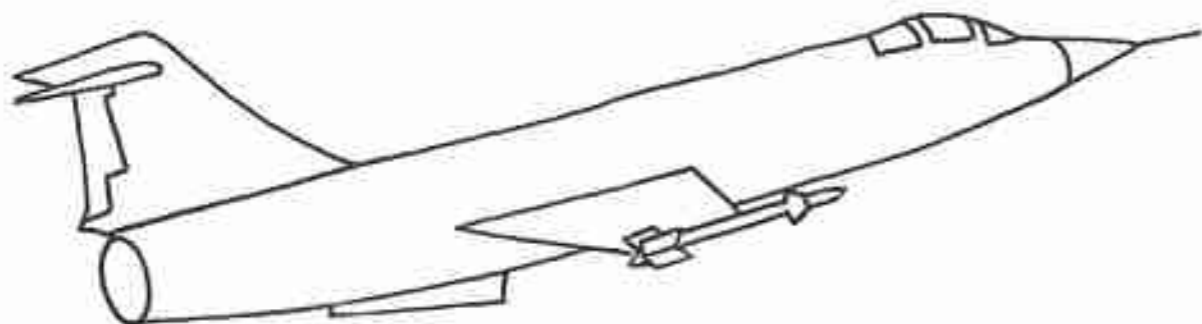

FLY IN THE SKY There are many different ways to travel by air. Here are some pictures of interesting aircraft to color.



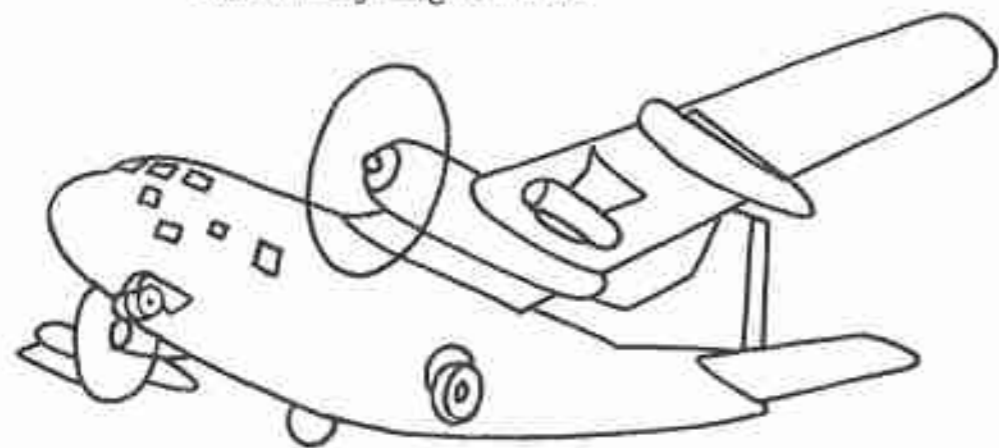

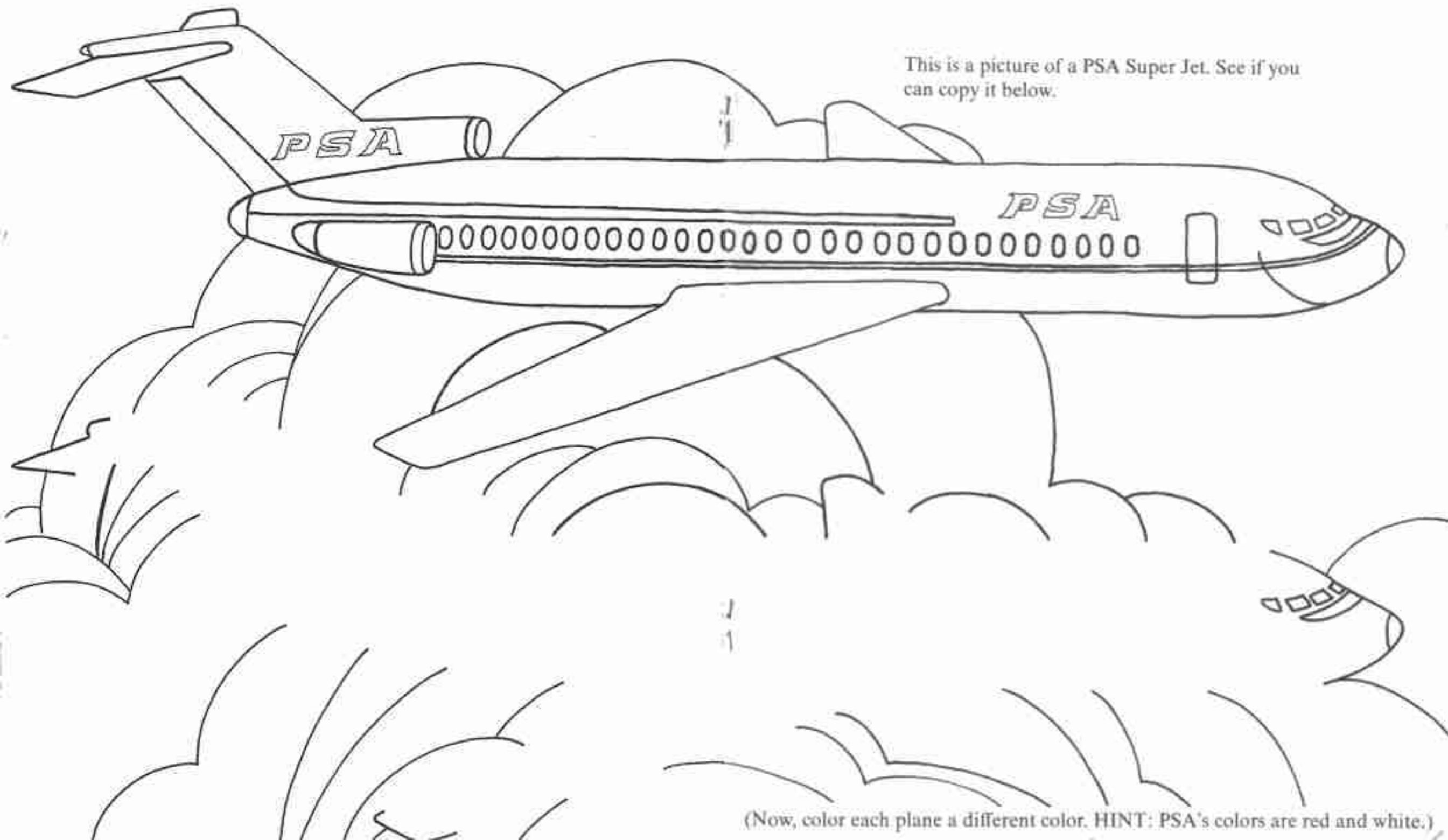

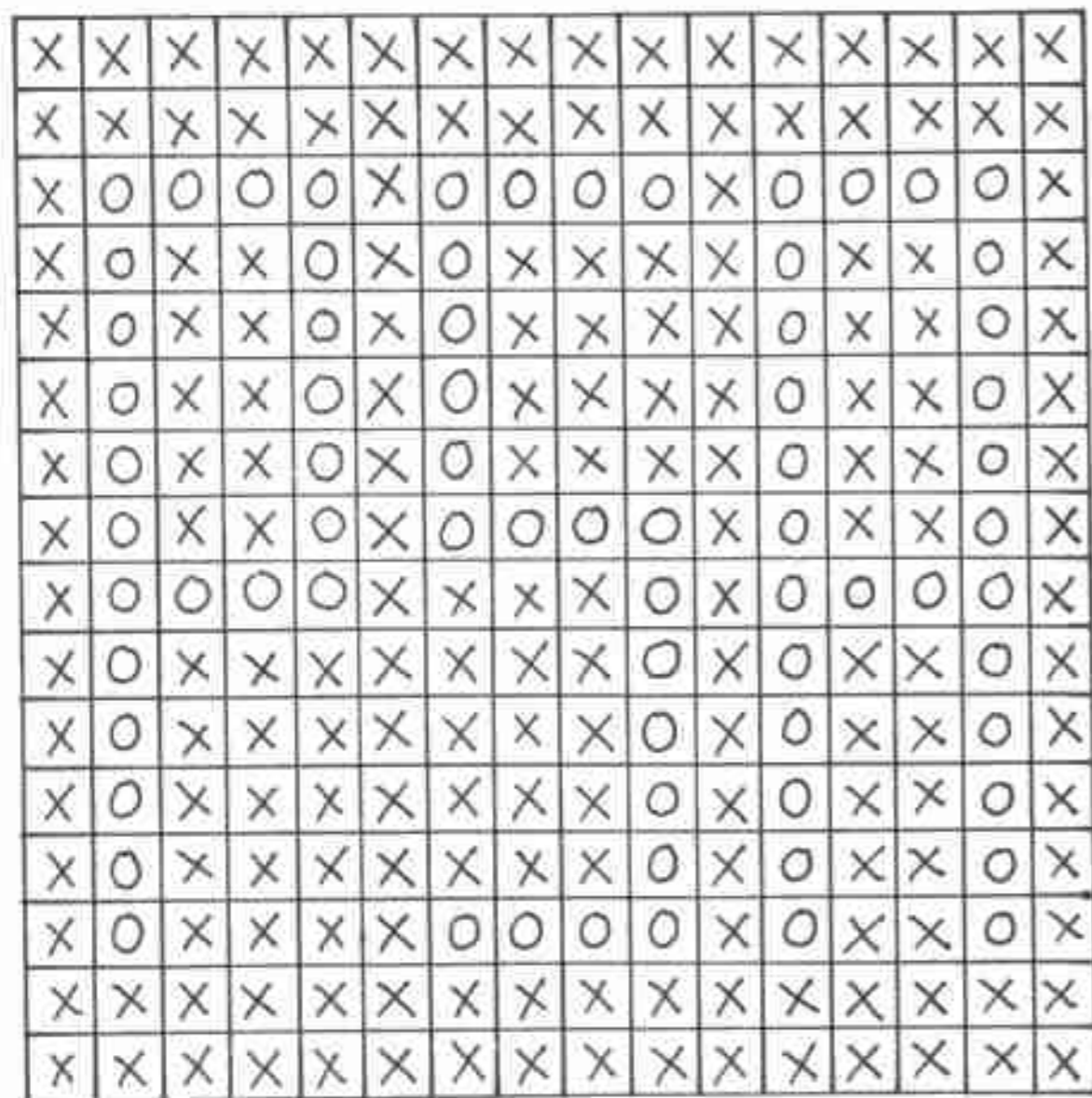

This is a picture of a PSA Super Jet. See if you can copy it below.



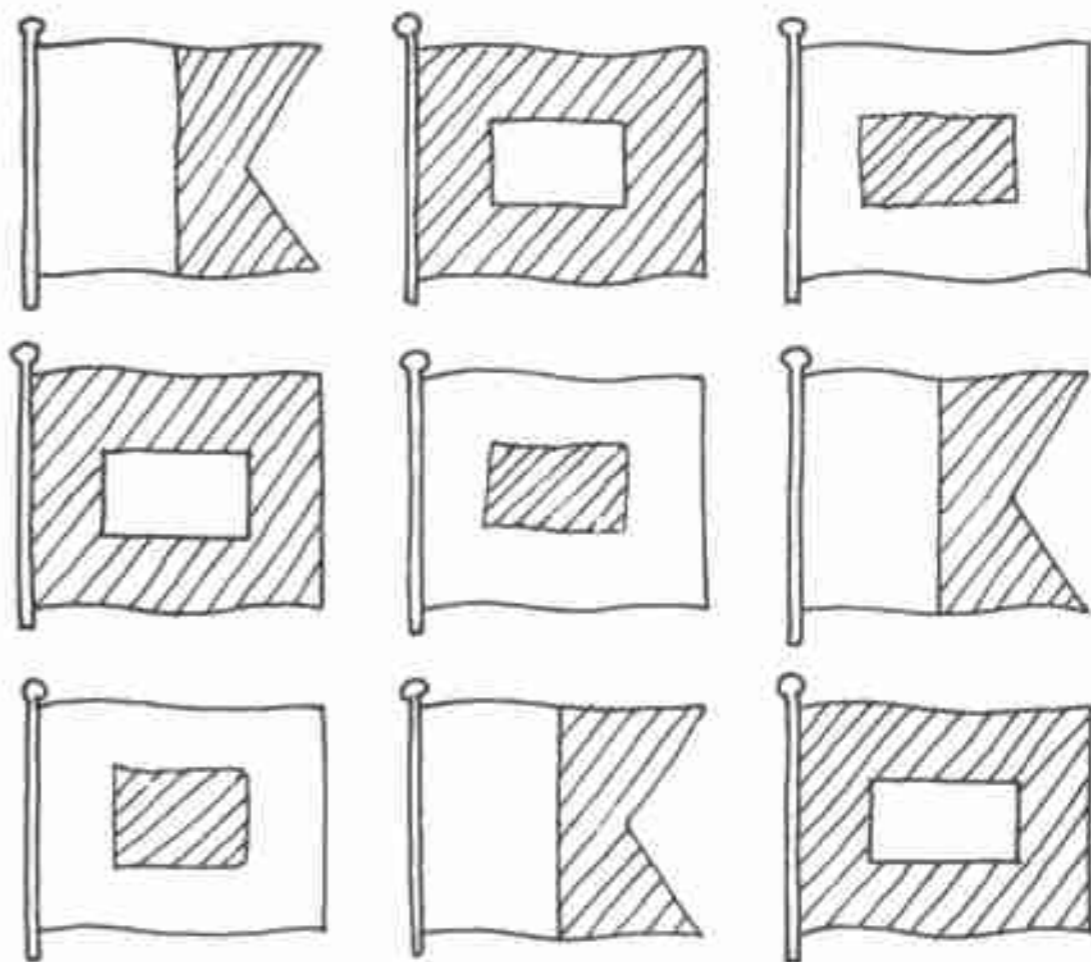

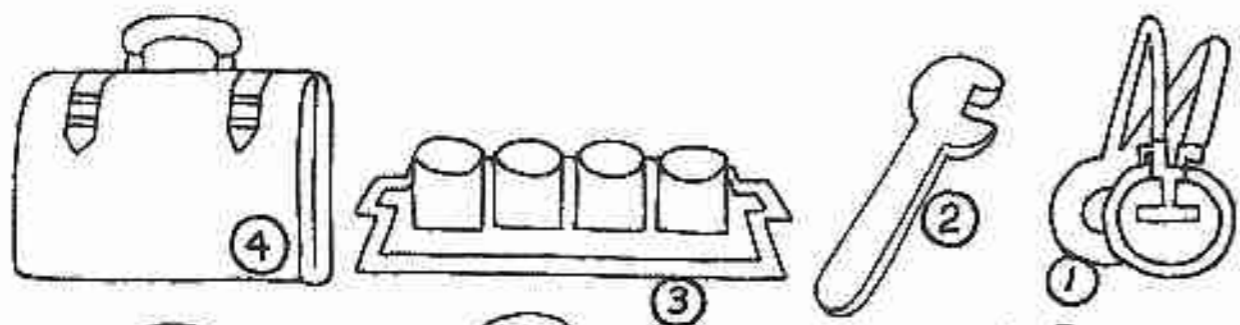

These are some of the flags of the international code of signals. Each flag below has two just like it. Color the matching ones the same color.

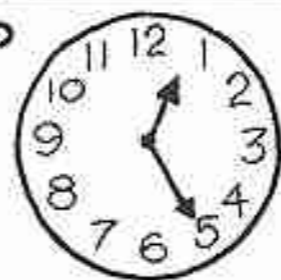
